Board Composition: Seven voting members: six licensed geologists, and one public member. The State Geologist or designee as *ex-officio* also participates on the Board as a *non-voting member*.

Requirements:

Experience: Four years after academic requirements are met; after July 1, 2000, two of these years must be under supervision of a registered geologist or a geologist in responsible charge.
